Inter-District Attendance Transfer Requests: While most students attend their local school, there may be special circumstances in which a student requests to attend a school outside of the area where they live. The request process begins with the family submitting an Annual Inter-district Attendance Transfer Agreement (AIATA) to the District of Residence (where the child lives).
